Summary of Highlights of Conference

- Todays, we rank 122/157 in SDG index long way to go
- Pakistan's climate scenario is very serious.
 - o Economic Growth is low and vulnerable; macro fiscal condition is impacted
 - Climate related disasters have caused enormous damages. Recent rains and floods have directly impacted 33 million people and over 16 billion dollars in direct damages to infrastructure.
 - o Pakistan is a low GHG producing country It can utilize the production
 - o Pakistan can integrate climate and development through an propriate action plan

- Our aquatic life is under huge stress due to multiple challenges
 - o Marine data is not appropriately recorded or acquired
 - o Only 0. 16% out of total marine area is declared projected
 - Need to align with un declare of ocean science
- Gender Issues
 - Our women folk face many problems constrained access to essential services.
 - Pakistan ranks 151 in 153 in global gender gap report.
- Law and Justice
 - Our legal framework needs an independent review for making it responsive to challenges of sustainability
 - Status of under privilege in cities is becoming intrinsically vulnerable. housing, one of the most essential human needs, is impossible to attain, given the economic, social and administrative constraints.
